

Foodoku ~ Puzzle 3a

Foodoku was invented by Marian Buchanan as a variation of the Japanese puzzle game Sudoku. To play it, you need the Foodoku picture pieces. They are on a separate sheet.

Complete the puzzle by filling the rest of the squares with picture pieces so the board ends up like this:

- each column has one of each picture -- a column is 9 squares in a line between the top and bottom
- each row has one of each picture -- a row is 9 squares in a line between the left and right
- each box has one of each picture -- a box is one of the coloured squares
 (3x3 square grid of 9 connected smaller squares, marked by the thicker lines)

You can't have more than one of each picture in any row, column, or box.
